

Figure 10. Morley gate, circa 1935, looking north along Morley Avenue into downtown Nogales, Arizona. Lighted masonry pillars like those found at the main gate (see figure 9) are also evident here. In the right foreground is the Mexican garita with seated guard in front, and in the midground is the overhang of the U.S. gatehouse through which autos are lined up. Ville de Paris and Bracker's Department Store signs are partially visible on right. Two figures shake hands across the boundary at left, with one man shouldering a serape. Given the heavy coats with fur lining sported by the ladies on the right and the absence of leaves on the tree behind the gatehouse, this is probably a winter scene. Nogales, as some visitors perhaps failed to recognize, is situated at almost 4,000 feet elevation.
