Course Description

We survey the development, criticism, and competing theories of Russian realist prose in a European context from the 1840s to the 1880s, by writers including Ivan Goncharov, Evgeniia Tur, Ivan Turgenev, Nadezhda Khvoshchinskaia, Lev Tolstoy, Nadezhda Sokhanskaia, Fyodor Dostoevsky, Mikhail Saltykov-Shchedrin, Nikolai Leskov, and Anton Chekhov.

Requirements

- Weekly one-paragraph response to study questions, typed, due in class. I grade them with a $\sqrt{-}$, $\sqrt{-}$, or $\sqrt{+}$. In Russian or English. (15%)
- A five-page paper that is theoretically informed on a literary work, in Russian or English, due Wed. October 18. (25%)
- A ten-page paper that is theoretically informed on an author, due Wed., November 29. Choose an author by November 1, with a list of 3 works you plan to read by him or her. (40%)
- Final take-home exam on different approaches to Realism based on passages from works in the course, which you must identify. (20%)
