Adjectives <i>hàng, toàn, toàn bộ, toàn thể</i></li> <li>5. <i>Mà, lại, mới</i> with different meanings and functions.</li> <li>6. <i>Nổi, xuế</i>, indicating a person's ability to do something.</li> <li>7.
