Andrew J. Odle, being first duly sworn and examined,
deposes and says:

My name is Andrew J. Odle: I was born in Clay Co., Tenn., in 1861: I claim my Indian blood through my father: I claim no Indian blood through my mother: my father's name was John Odle: my father was born in Jackson Co., Tenn. in 1818: my father got his Indian blood through his mother, whose name was Nancy Rich: my grandmother, Nancy Rich, was born in Jackson Co., Tenn.: Nancy Rich was the maiden name of my grandmother: I do not remember my grandmother, Nancy Rich: my grandmother, Nancy Rich, was born in 1784: Nancy Rich claimed her Indian blood through her mother, whose maiden name was Polly Hooker, so I have been told: Nancy Rich was the daughter of Jesse Rich: I have been told the above by my father: I do not know where my great grandmother, Polly Hooker, was born or when she was born: I heard that she came from E. C., (I do not know what part) to Jackson Co., Tenn.: I heard from my aunt, who is 101 years old, and also my father that my great grandmother, Polly Hooker, lived with the Cherokee Indians as a member of the tribe: I do not know when or where: I do not know whether my grandmother, Nancy Rich, ever lived with the Cherokee Indians as a member of the tribe or not: in 1835 my grandmother, Nancy Rich, and my father, John Odle, lived in Jackson Co., Tenn.: I do not know whether they lived with the Cherokee Indians in 1835 as a member of the tribe or not: in 1831 my father and grandmother through whom I claim my Cherokee Indian blood, lived in Jackson Co., Tenn.: I never heard that my father or grandmother were ever enrolled, but I heard that my great grandmother, Polly Hooker, was enrolled: I do not know whether they ever received any money, land or other benefit or not: none of my father's brothers ever went West with the Cherokee Indians that I know of: I think my father and grandmother had an Indian but I do not know what it was: none of the ancestors through whom I claim were ever held in bondage: my wife, Sarah Strong Odle (appl. 28515) was my second cousin and her great grandmother was Polly Hooker: I am considered a white man in the community in which I live, but it is generally known in the community that I am part Cherokee Indian: Allie H. G. Waddle is my third cousin (appl. 39872): her great great grandmother is Polly Hooker: (All applications grouped 28514 should be grouped with 12573.)
