- 1. In HW 2, I asked how you could tell the subject and object apart in your language (agreement, Case, word order or a mix). After reading chapter 9, agreement and Case marking should be a little clearer.

 Could you therefore now give some sentences (with good glosses) that show (a) that 'your' language has agreement or not, and (b) that your languages has Case or not.
- 2. This question is probably difficult and I can talk a little about this in class. Is your language nominative/accusative or ergative/absolutive or neither?

 Again, provide well-glossed examples! A few of you have ergative language but don't worry. Just do this as best as you can!
- 3. How is definiteness expressed in your language? For instance, `the dog' as opposed to `a/some dog' could be expressed by a suffix or an article or a demonstrative pronoun, or agreement on the verb, or by a special Case, or by its position in the sentence.

 Explain with at least 3 examples what you think is going on.
- 4. Is gender relevant in the language you selected? Give examples that suggest it does or doesn't.
